Ms. Lee made her orchestral debut performing as soloist with the Los Angeles Doctors Symphony Orchestra and is currently a member of the Young Musicians Foundations Chamber Music Series, Junior Chamber Music, and Chamber Music OC's Young Artist Program. Ms. Lee has won numerous competitions including the Robert Turner Piano Concerto Competition; the Young Pianist, Open Chopin, and Open Baroque Categories of the Southwestern Youth Music Festival; the MTNA California Association of Professional Music Teachers Honors Audition State Finals; the Alice Frazier Kitchen Scholarship Competition; the Southern California Junior Bach Festival Complete works; the Orange County Korean Cultural Center Music Competition; the Montectio International Music Festival Junior Solo Competition; and the Los Angeles

Korea Times Music Competition. She has participated in master classes with Stewart Gordon, Wojciech Kocyan, Benjamin Loh, Daniel Shapiro, and John Perry, and has attended the Montecito International Music Festival.

Alexander (Sasha) Boldachev

One of the most extraordinary young harpists of our time, Sasha Boldachev began playing the harp at the age of 5 and began performing in concerts that same year. He made his orchestral debut at the age of 9, performing a concert by Handel with the Lithuanian State Symphony Orchestra. Mr. Boldachev graduated from the Special Music School of the St. Petersburg State Conservatory, having studied harp under Karina Maleeva and composition under Svetlana Lavrova. In 2006, he entered the Zurich University of the Arts in Switzerland, where he continued his studies under Catherine Michel and Sarah O'Brien. After earning his BA and MA, he is continuing his postgraduate studies in Zurich. Over the last decade, Mr. Boldachev has won several top prizes including the UFAM International Competition, the Vera Dulova Harp Competition, the Felix Godefroid Competition, the Martin Geliot International Harp Competition, the Lily Laskine International Harp Competition, and the Golden Harp International Competition. In 2003, he

became the first non-British winner of Britain's Brilliant Prodigies Award, followed by The European Foundation for Culture Pro Europe Award (Vienna, Austria) for "outstanding artistic talent and contribution to European culture" in 2005. In that same year, he performed a solo recital at the IX World Harp Congress in Dublin, Ireland. Mr. Boldachev has toured and conducted master classes throughout Europe, Brazil and Japan.
